Ageing in Europe and in the World **77** (N+%) Emergence of 4-5 generations of which 2-3 generations of retirees who want and can have a life long healthy and active ageing

VS no age-specific binding human rights of older persons no ethical framework

Silent revolution vs silent involution

Structural elements

What exists currently at the UN on older persons?

- * Specific UN institution or institutional structure: none
- * Specific budget : very scarce disproportional to the importance of ageing 2 fixed official lead positions + secretariat - no budget 7. UNDESA, 2. WHO Production of official ad hoc documents: WHO, UNFPA, UNHCR, DESA Pop. D.
 - Organisation of UN events on ageing: WAA, IYOP99
 - UNOHCHR: new independent expert, rapporteur on health, Cedaw
- Official focal points = none
- Ageing Issues in other UN agencies = none, or ad hoc
- Multilateral agencies: very scarce (e.g. very few documents (e.g. World Bank)

Operational elements Ageing in the UN Development Agenda

- Older persons not on the majority of UN spec progr/agencies agenda, reports, conferences
- No mention in the MDGs and global plan of actions
- No life long perspective on many topics ILO, UNESCO, UNDP, UNICEF, UNWomen, etc
- No age or generation perspective to the Right to Development .
- No specific item on the Human Right Council ... yet ...

BUT

Event-based operations such as WAA-MIPAA → UNECE working group

PROBI EM

no mainstreaming - no interaction - included in 'vulnerable groups'

What about human rights of older persons?

LANDMARKS: HUMAN RIGHTS OF OLDER PERSON AT THE UN

1948: Universal Declaration of Human Rights Art. 2 = no mention "[... without any distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, [..] or other status. Art 25, mention of social security: [..] right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control.

OHCHR

1990: International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families [resolution 45/158 of 18 December 1990]

Their Traimines [resolution 40:106 or 10 December 1990] Art. 1 The present Convention is applicable, except as otherwise provided hereafter, to all migrant workers and members of their framilies without distinction of any kind such as exer, race, colour, language, religion or conviction, political ophinon, national, ethnic or social origin, nationality, sage, economic position, propried, martial status, birth or other status

OHCHR - Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights

1995: General Comment no. 6: The economic, social and cultural rights of older persons

 2008: General comment 19: The right to social security
 2009: General comment 20: Non-Discrimination in Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (at. 2, para. 2)
 Specific provisions of the Covvenant such as : Article 3 Equal rights of men and women, Article 8 Rights relating to work, Article 9: Rights tp social security

CEDAW – Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women 1979 2010: General Recommendation No. 27 on older women and protection of their human rights.

Movement towards a Convention → 2 meetings April and August 2011





How can Human rights advance at the United Nations

EU-Science-scientific associations = NGOs (Non-governmental organisations)

→ they have a key role to play
 → they give a constant reality-check to both
 → they are the bridge between NGOs and Policy-makers









Crucial Statements call for very precise actions...

The NGO Committee on Ageing Geneva

- A rapporteur on violation of rights of older persons
- Mainstreaming of ageing in the agenda of all UN agencies, esp. HRC
- Create a specific item on rights of older persons , not only in "vulnerable groups" A Convention on the rights of older persons

Leon Ministerial conference (2008) = Scientifc and NGO statement

- UNESCO bioethical guidelines = section on old persons
- Ethical framework in in the development and research agenda ERC, CIOMS .
- Human Rights framework for older persons

IAGG European Region = scientific statement

. Bologna 2011: The Bologna Declaration calling for Human Rights R&D
